# Remote Learning Students



#### Three groups of students

- Remote Learners
- On-Site students (traditional attendance brick and mortar)
- Virtual



#### Students: 2020-2021

Remember, no such thing as "hybrid" learner....

Remote Learning students – are remote when not On-Site

Examples of Hybrid attendance = Remote Learning students:

- Attending On-Site: M, T then Remotely W, Th and F
- Attending On-Site: Th, F then Remotely M, T and W
- Attending On-Site Monday am and Thursday am & all else Remotely



Requirements for Remote Learners are based on...

Navigating Change - <u>District</u> Assurance document...

- Remote Learning is as close as possible to On-Site learning, so student can make seamless transition
- Meaningful daily connection with licensed educator/teacher
- Academic progress is monitored daily



# Assurances – Remote Learning – District Assurance doc – revised as of 9/14/20...

For 2020-21 school year only, a Remote Learning student is a student regularly enrolled in the school district he or she would normally have attended On-Site, but the student is attending remotely (because of concerns related to the COVID-19 pandemic) and curriculum and instruction are prepared, provided and/or supervised by local teachers and staff in the student's home district.
USD assures to the Kansas State Board of Education it will follow the requirements below to ensure that Remote Learning approximates the student learning experience taking place in the On-Site (brick and mortar) classroom for the 2020-21 school year, including:
1. USD assures Remote Learning Curriculum and Instruction will coincide with each student's On-Site classroom to ensure that when a Remote Learning student returns to the On-Site classroom that he or she is able to make a seamless transition. In addition, Remote Learning students will be assessed on the same standards and competencies as the On-Site students using each and all progress, academic and social-emotional monitoring assessments as On-Site students.
<ol> <li>USD assures Remote Learners will have at least one meaningful Daily Connection with a local teacher. In addition, Remote Learning students will have ready access to all local content teachers throughout each week and student questions will be answered within 24 hours during school days, preferably the same school day if possible.</li> </ol>
<ol> <li>USD assures each Remote Learner's Academic Progress will be monitored daily by local teachers to ensure that when the student is able to return to the On-Site classroom that he or she is able to make a seamless transition.</li> </ol>
<ol> <li>USD assures that timely and relevant Professional Development will be provided to all local educators providing services to Remote Learners.</li> </ol>

## Remote Learning: attendance

Remote Learners attend one of two ways:

- Via live-stream or
- Instructional services are provided some other way



Remote learners attending via *live-stream*, means:

- HS/MS: student is attending each and every class via live-stream length of session is local decision/teacher decision
  - instruction provided
  - attendance taken
- Elem (and PreK): AM <u>and</u> PM live-stream sessions length of session is local decision
  - instruction provided
  - attendance taken



If Remote Learning students <u>not</u> attending via live-stream (as described), then must provide:

- daily meaningful contact
  - telephone call
  - interactive video call
  - not email, not text
- parent assurance doc



#### Don't forget:

For those Remote Learning students not attending via live-stream:

#### Daily meaningful contact means, just that and:

- must be licensed educator
- telephone call
- or interactive video call
- should not just be for the purpose of taking attendance
- not email, not text





#### Quarantined Students



#### Quarantined students

- If well enough to participate
- Treat them as Remote Learners
- Must meet requirements that we just covered...
  - attend either via live-stream or
  - instructional services are provided some other way and
    - daily meaningful contact
    - parent assurance doc



# Snow Days/Inclement Weather



#### **Snow Day**

The question:

This year, can we count a snow day as a school day? (can it count toward the 1116 hour/186 day School Term?)



#### **Snow Day**

Answer: Yes, BUT...

 must provide Remote Learning services – meet requirements (either live-stream or parent assurance doc and daily contact)

#### Also must consider:

- Does everyone have what they need? Teachers? Students?
- Meals



#### Snow Day - meals

SNOW DAY & <u>no</u> Remote Learning: meals not required (it's a snow day – but you can choose to offer meals)

Snow Day & providing Remote Learning:

- USDA wants meals served if that is at all possible...
- Follow your extreme weather meal service policy/plan ....what does that mean?



# Snow Day - If Remote Learning Day

Follow your extreme weather meal service policy/plan...

That means...

#### Must update Site Application in KnClaim:

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP): Ques 62 and Ques 63

Seamless Summer Option (SSO): Ques 66



# Snow Day - If Remote Learning Day

#### <u>Updating</u> your Site Application in KnClaim:

- Detail what your plan is for providing access to meals
- Detail how households will be notified
- Explain in detail what is severe enough to stop meal service

Plan <u>cannot</u> simply be: we aren't going to serve meals during Snow Day/Remote Learning day



## **Updating Site Application in KnClaim:**

Q62: Arrangements have been made for food service during inclement weather: Yes, No or NA (N/A if snow day)

Q63: If arrangements have been made for service, please explain (Details)

<u>Detail</u> your extreme weather meal service policy/plan, then follow it



# Snow Day - Remote Learning - meals

**Need ideas on making arrangements** for meals during snow day that is a Remote Learning day?

Call/email your KSDE Child Nutrition & Wellness consultant

For certain, do these things...

- Have a plan (again do this by updating your Site Application)
- Don't forget can plan meals ahead but need to allow time



# Snow Day - Remote Learning - meals

Need ideas on making arrangements for meals during snow day that is a Remote Learning day?

Things to consider.....

- May want to survey households before making a plan
- Consider having one site stocked with emergency meals and a plan for staff to get to them
- Make sure policy for meals on snow day/remote learning day doesn't create barriers to access or discriminate



# **Snow Day - Remote Learning**

Districts must conduct verification for 2020-21

- Districts have until February 28, 2021 to verify apps
- KSDE CNW is conducting training on Dec 1 at 2 pm via Zoom
- You can complete verification <u>before</u> the Feb 28th deadline
- Verification screens are <u>ready</u> in KnClaim now



## Verification: School Lunch Program

Districts must conduct verification for 2020-21

Details: What will audit look like?

- Same steps for auditing verification...
- If you don't verify 3% of apps = 3% reduction in at-risk count

#### Did I mention?....

- You can complete verification <u>before</u> the Feb 28th deadline
- Verification screens are <u>ready</u> in KnClaim now





# **Professional Development**

1116 hour/186 day School Term requirement



## Professional Development/Inservice

Encouraged districts to front-load days this year, many did

Still (at this point), count ½ the time, so...

1 day = ½ day toward 1116 hour School Term requirement

State Board/KSDE is continuing to monitor

- at December State Board meeting – will revisit
